# Charitable Programme

Our charitable programme aims to strike a balance between:

- (i) benefitting the local community vs members of our own school community, and
- (ii) acting in collaboration with school in appreciation of our mutually beneficial relationship vs allowing our members a choice in the selection of the beneficiaries of our charitable giving.





## Partnerships

Each year, we spend a portion of our budget to support the charities that school has formed partnership with; we go where school goes. In the 2023-24 academic year, the beneficiaries were Rackets Cubed, Regenerate, The Shooting Star and Paddock School.

## FIPS Bursary+

Starting with the 2024-25 academic year, FIPS covers certain expenses of pupils on partial bursary (such as digital device scheme, GCSE and A-level exam fees, UCAS fees, etc.), that are not paid for them by the school's own bursary provision. This year, FIPS has also committed all revenues from the sale of second-hand uniform to this budget.

## Pupil-focused equipment

The school's infrastructure is excellent and continually improving. FIPS supports additional enhancements—like a weather station, a DT kit car, or a new Prep School greenhouse—by setting an annual budget for such extras.

## Matched Funding

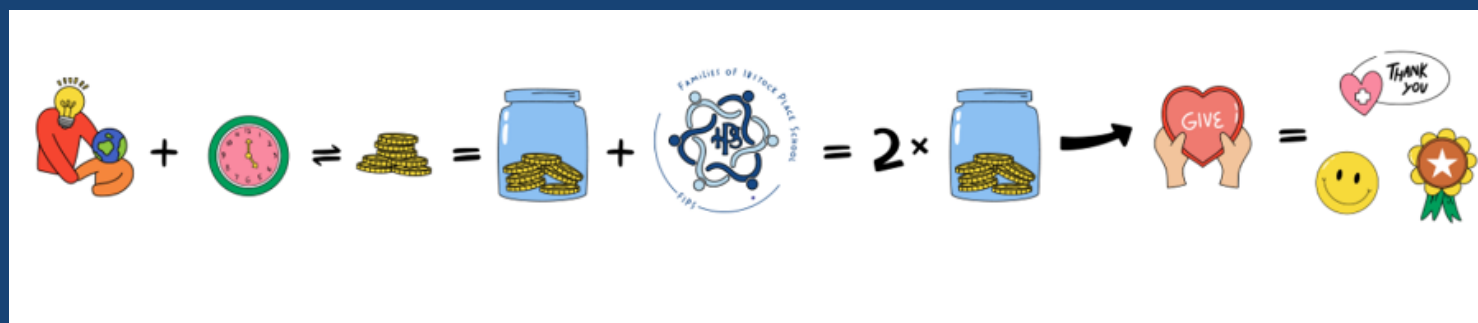
FIPS created the Matched Funding Programme to encourage volunteer work by our pupils and to give them a voice in determining which charities should receive our financial support.
